BUDGET UPDATE June 2013

Baulkham Hills has been a big winner in this year's NSW Budget, with our community to benefit from:

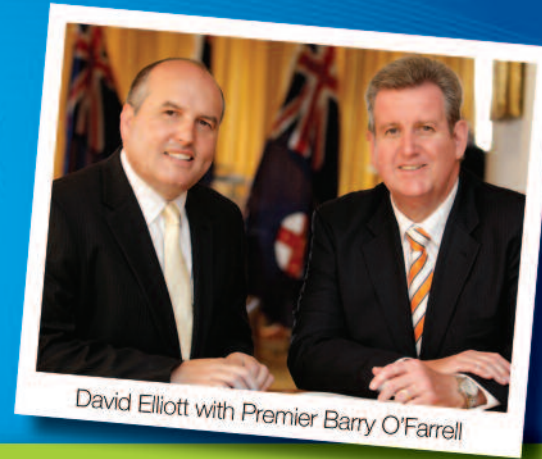
- \$500,000 for planning work to widen Memorial Avenue in Kellyville, between Windsor Road and Old Windsor Road
- \$500,000 to extend the bus bay on Old Northern Road opposite Baulkham Hills TAFE
- \$400,000 to construct a new bus bay on Old Northern Road opposite Ackling Street
- \$373,000 to install traffic signals at Anderson and Windsor Roads, Northmead
- A new farm shed for Northmead High School, upgraded food technology facilities for Crestwood High School and upgraded toilets for Baulkham Hills High School
- \$129,000 for school crossing supervisors who keep our children safe
- \$1.9 million on T-way station maintenance
- \$36 million for 76 new buses servicing our transport needs

Message from the Premier

The NSW Liberals & Nationals Government is securing the future of the State by delivering a budget that consolidates the rewards of tough decisions and reforms.

We've managed to again live within our means and reduce debt to get the Budget back on track to surplus.

Despite global economic challenges, we are committed to delivering our election commitments to improve frontline services, protect the vulnerable and invest in critical infrastructure – whilst maintaining NSW's triple-A credit rating.

This Budget boosts funding for Health by \$884 million; Education by \$524 million; and Police by \$171 million. This builds on the 5,000 additional nurses, teachers and police officers recruited since March 2011.

A record \$14.6 billion investment in transport and roads will help deliver better infrastructure and improved services. The Budget will also provide a \$300 million boost to the Building the State package – extending the first homebuyers scheme and providing priority infrastructure to increase the supply of new housing.

This Budget is about securing our future to make NSW number one.

Securing Baulkham Hills' Future

The NSW 2013-14 Budget consolidates the rewards of tough decisions and reforms undertaken over the past two years to secure the future for Baulkham Hills.

Despite revenues falling below expectations, NSW is now living within its means. This Budget invests in services and infrastructure while reducing forecast debt by \$9 billion.

The NSW Budget 2013-14 invests almost \$60 billion for infrastructure across the State.

Business owners from Baulkham Hills will benefit from the lift in the payroll tax threshold and the increased payroll tax rebate for new jobs. First homebuyers from Baulkham Hills who buy a new home will benefit from the extension of the Building the State package with more than \$35,000 in assistance available.

Budget investments for Western Sydney

- \$806 million has been allocated for construction of the North West Rail Link;
- \$23 million to continue work on the upgrade of Schofields Road and \$22m to continue work on the upgrade of Richmond Road;
- \$82.4 million to continue construction of the Blacktown Mount Druitt Hospital and to continue work on the Blacktown Hospital car park expansion;
- For the Ponds, a new primary school, funding allocated to continue construction of the new high school and The Ponds School for Specific Purposes; and
- \$525 million to expand and improve services for people with disability, their families and carers and older people in the Western Sydney Region.
